


**Football** – the children who played in the team against Peel Hall on Wednesday won their quarter final match 7 – 0. Well done!

Reception have been busy learning about the life cycle of a plant.

They have completed some amazing writing labelling parts of a plant, and have created their own life cycles.

The children loved planting different vegetables and can't wait for them to grow, we talked about what is needed to help a plant grow and how we can look after them.

Year 2 have had a lovely week. In maths we have been looking at fractions and finding a half and a quarter. In our Master Maths lessons we have been looking at odd numbers and how they are partitioned. In English we have been creating our own characters for the Tear Thief story ready to write our own versions of the story next week. Some of characters look fantastic! In science we have been exploring different plants and looking at how plants survive in hot and cold places.

Year 1 have had a very busy week practising for our class assembly. We have all worked really hard to practise our lines and we did an amazing job. We are so proud of ourselves! In Science we have been looking at fruit and vegetable plants, trees and wild flowers. We have been sorting them into categories based on our own observations. In maths we have been comparing capacity and took part in a very fun experiment. We had jugs and bowls of different sizes and we recorded how many cups of water it took to fill each container. After that we compared the results to see which container had the greatest capacity. There was a special visitor who came in this week and told us some really fun Bible stories. It was really interesting and she even dressed up as a shepherd!

Year 3 have had a great week of learning. In maths we have continued exploring fractions, using magnetic 3D shapes, broken into pieces to explore the numerator. The class have worked hard to compare and order fractions too.

In writing, we have continued to use fronted adverbials in our sentences as well as researching through an online thesaurus, more ambitious vocabulary to use in our sentences.

In Science this week, we have explored how our muscles enable us to move and have used scientific terminology to explain this clearly. Well done Year 3!

Year 4 children have had another busy week. In English, we finally completed writing losing tales. Children are extremely proud of the work they have produced. In maths, we have moved onto decimals. This week, we have been exploring tenths as fractions and tenths as decimals. In History, we have been learning about Ancient Egyptian inventions. This sadly was our last lesson about Ancient Egypt as we are about to move to another fascinating unit. And finally, on Thursday we went to All Hallows RC High School for a transition day. It was amazing seeing our Year 4 children so engaged, well behaved and representing our proudly.



On Monday the whole school considered the importance of Internet safety. The with their children impressed us knowledge and understanding of the need to THINK before sharing online. In maths Year 5 have been calculating the perimeter of composite rectilinear shapes. The children needed to work out the length of some sides before they could calculate the perimeter. In RE lessons and 'Prayer and Liturgy' we have been considering what Jesus taught us about forgiveness by sharing the Parable of the Lost Sheep. Sometimes we get 'lost' - we do selfish or thoughtless things and feel far from God but, like the shepherd, Jesus will help us to come back to him. This was reinforced by a visit from The Bible Encounter Trust and an assembly all about Jesus, the Good Shepherd.


